



Heevie Annual Report for 2020



Heevie Organization, as a national independent non-profit organization, aims to help and support the vulnerable populations from both genders and all age groups who are exposed to disasters, conflicts and crises in different areas and to establish and develop projects in the field of health and community which increase the welfare and preserve the mental and physical wellbeing. Heevie aims to provide the requirements and needs for developing and improving the health care services in coordination with the local and governmental authorities or with the foreign organizations and agencies in the field of helping, reconstructing and humanitarian activities.

The health system in Kurdistan Region specifically and in Iraq generally, has been through multiple difficulties as a result of the successive wars and conflicts along with the financial crises in the region, issues that rendered the health authorities unable to provide the needed services in the optimum way. The situation was further deteriorated with the increasing needs of thousands IDP and refugee families distributed over multiple camp and non-camp locations. The new situation made it necessary for all the efforts to be brought together order to fill the available gaps in the health care system and to assure the provision and access to the health care services for all the vulnerable populations.

As a local organization, and with the available resources and with the valuable support of the donors, Heevie continued implementing multiple activities in the different crises affected regions in Iraq and KRI, these activities and projects covered the below mentioned fields:

- 1- Providing the specialized services on the tertiary health care level, this include supporting the providing the management for the children with congenital heart diseases in coordination with the Italian partners, hospitals and specialized centers.
- 2- Registering and documentation of the patients with congenital heart diseases
- 3- Establishing, renovation and rehabilitation of the health care facilities, involving primary, secondary and tertiary levels
- 4- Capacity building and training of the medical and health staff and supporting MOH facilities
- 5- Supporting the providing the primary health care services for the vulnerable populations and groups from IDPs, returnees and host communities in the different and non-camp locations.
- 6- Providing specialized medical services for specific groups of vulnerable populations, like the Physical Rehabilitation services, Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services and Reproductive Health Services.

During the year 2020, Heevie Organization continued implementing its projects and activities aiming to provide the humanitarian assistance to the vulnerable populations and the people need throughout the country. During this year, about (255,591) consultations were recorded win the different health facilities run by Heevie.

Heevie interventions were on the primary, secondary and tertiary health care levels. The primary health care services provided involved both in curative and preventive and involved clinical examination, treatment, reproductive health services, mental health, psychosocial support, nutrition, vaccination, dental, laboratory, ultrasound, minor surgeries, health education and promotion and referral services to the secondary and higher health care centers. On the secondary and tertiary levels, Heevie continued its program for treating children with congenital heart diseases in addition to the activities for supporting MOH facilities and capacity building for the local medical staff.

Heevie, as an active member of the national and local health cluster, continued participating actively in different meetings, workshops and committees with an optimum coordination with the local health authorities and international parties

1. Treating Patients and Training the Local Medical staff in cooperation with Italian organizations

Heevie Organization in its efforts to provide the best treatment and management opportunities for the patients suffering from chronic and difficult to be treated diseases; this is done through a well-organized program implemented in coordination with the Italian hospitals, centers and organizations. This specific Heevie project is active since 2006, through which Heevie is providing the necessary medical assistance for children with various diseases and those with congenital and acquired organ malformations through the surgical intervention and other management modalities. The cases treated involved children with congenital heart diseases, renal and genital systems malformations, patients with malignancies, blood disorders and others.

By the support of the KRI government and in coordination with the Italian partners, hundreds of children suffering from various medical and surgical problems were sent to Italy to receive the necessary medical and surgical treatment according to the nature of the diseases and the treatment required. In a step to better prepare the local facilities for such interventions, Heevie organization and in coordination with KRI government and the Italian partners provided the necessary support in order to establish the local health infrastructure so as to be ready perform the program activities. In this field, specialized Italian teams started to visit KRI according to a regular schedule, usually, a minimum of 4 missions/year were performed during which more than 200 operations were done (50 operations per each mission).

With the start of the ISIS occupation and wars and after the last crises and security instability in Iraq, the Italian teams were unable to visit the country; as a solution for that and instead, Heevie used to collect the most acute patients and send them to Italy for operations. Total number of patients underwent surgical interventions in Italy during the year 2020 are (2) patients. Efforts are ongoing by Heevie to resume the program in Iraq through regulating new missions for the Italian teams according to the needs and gaps.

Heevie got benefit from the specialized Italian teams during their regular visits to the region to perform the capacity building for the local staff through involving them in the overall steps of the program, involving the different management steps and all the intervention procedures performed. This was done through performing special training programs for the local staff on the different topics related to the medical and surgical interventions, starting from preparation of the patients for the surgical operations, going through the surgical interventions, postoperative follow up and care, ICU monitoring, treatment of complications and performing various medical and surgical procedures. The program also involved training of the doctors (mainly pediatricians) on Echocardiography examination for the patients with congenital heart diseases in Italy. The project of treating patients and training the local medical staff was implemented by the support of many partners and donors especially the Italian organizations, hospitals and centers, American embassy at Baghdad and other donors.

2.Project: Registering and examining the Congenital Heart Diseases Children in Kurdistan Region

The epidemiological studies are recording large number of the children with congenital heart diseases in Iraq and Kurdistan Region. The non-availability of the necessary interventional methods urged Heevie to develop a strict program for providing the required assistance to those patients. This was done in cooperation with SIA Italian NGO and in coordination with the different Italian hospitals and specialized centers. Through this program, Heevie took the initiative to build up and establishing a data base for the patients Congenital Heart Diseases in KRI and Iraq. Through this project, Heevie Organization is doing a regular documentation for all the possible cases of congenital heart diseases to make their information ready and available if any treatment or intervention modality required.

This is one of the first and most active Heevie programs and is having a great impact on the outcomes of these diseases and the life style of the patients. In addition to treating the patients, the program involved training of the doctors (mainly pediatricians) on the diagnostic procedures like the Echocardiography examination, for the patients with congenital heart diseases in Italy, in addition to providing Echocardiography machines for the main hospitals and centers in Duhok, Erbil and Sulaymaniah. During 2020, Heevie has so far added **(291)** new cases of children with congenital heart diseases to its existing data base.

3.Project: Mobile Medical Clinics

The unstable security situation and non-availability of the health infrastructure in many regions especially in the conflict affected areas, made Heevie organization to expand the activities of its Mobile Medical Clinics to reach the higher number of vulnerable populations in different regions.

Through the long time working with the mobile hospitals and clinics which is exceeding 18 years, Heevie has obtained the necessary expert and experience in running them; this long period had led to accumulation of expertise among Heevie administrative and medical staff. From the early beginning of the project, Heevie mobile clinics were covering the far-away villages and districts lacking the health facilities, after the events of the year 2014 and the subsequent wars and crises in the region, Heevie directed its MMCs to serve the vulnerable populations from IDPs, returnees and host communities in the conflict affected regions. This involved providing the primary health care services to various camp and non-camp locations in coordination the directorates of health in Duhok Ninewa and Erbil and also the health sub-clusters in the corresponding governorates and the humanitarian actors.

During the year 2020, Heevie activated five Mobile Medical Clinics to provide the health care services in the targeted locations, two of them allocated for Talkaif district of Ninewa governorate in addition the non-camp locations in Duhok governorate, and three allocated for Talafar district. All Heevie MMCs are performing their activities by the support of WHO. After the issues of COVID-19 pandemic and with the restriction of movement, and to avoid any transmission of the diseases, Heevie stopped the activities of the MMCs until the situation will be more favorable.

4.Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Mam Rash IDP camp in Ninewa governorate.

Heevie Organization is running its static clinic at Mam Rash IDPs camp, which is located in Sheikhan district of Ninewa and has the capacity of hosting around 10,000 people; the camp was established originally to gather the IDPs habiting the non-camp locations and unfinished buildings throughout Duhok governorate. As a response to the health needs of the IDPs in the Mam Rash, Heevie established its static PHCC in the camp to provide the necessary health care services.

Heevie clinic is providing the full package primary health care services with multiple health programs aiming to give the opportunity for the beneficiaries to have an easy, safe and free access to the health care service and minimize the need to seek the services elsewhere since the camp is far from the main MOH facilities and it is difficult for the its population to travel to the secondary facilities, by this, Heevie is decreasing the load on these facilities also. The camp clinic is currently serving more than 8,800 IDPs as direct beneficiaries in addition to many others from the villages surrounding the camp.

This project was implemented by the support of WHO, during the period of the project between January and December 2020, around **(32,236)** patients have visited the clinic and received various treatments and interventions.

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5.Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Shariya IDP camp in Ninewa governorate.

Shariya IDPs camp is of the biggest camps in Duhok governorate, the camp has the capacity of hosting 18,000 people. As a continuation for its programs to serve the IDPs in Duhok governorate, Heevie Organization is running the PHCC within the camp creating a valuable progress and development in the health service provision in the camp.

Multiple medical specialties are involved in the staff skeleton of the clinic, which is coming as a step from Heevie aiming to respond to nearly all the needs of the beneficiaries in the camp, and also minimizing the load and pressure on the secondary facilities in the region. The staff from the doctors involved internist, pediatrician, general surgeon, obstetrician, urologist and ENT specialist, in addition to the dental and ultrasound services.

This project was implemented by the support of WHO. During the year 2020, Heevie clinic provided the management and treatment for around **(39,756)** patients from Shariya camp population.

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6.Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Bersivy1 IDP camp in Duhok governorate

Bersivy1 IDPs camp is among the multiple camps in Duhok governorate hosting thousands of displaced people mostly from the Yezidi ethnic minority from Sinjar district who were displaced early during the war against ISIS in 2014. Heevie Organization is running the camp PHCC for the last two years and is continuous till now in providing the necessary assistance and aid for the vulnerable populations from the IDPs in the camp, as the health services are among the important services needed to be covered. Heevie clinic is providing the full package primary health care services, involving the curative and preventive care, psychosocial support, health promotion, growth monitoring, reproductive health, vaccination, dental care, laboratory and ultrasound services. The clinic is active 24/7 aiming to respond to the maximum needs if the beneficiaries.

During the year 2020, around **(32,932)** patients got benefit from the services provided within Heevie static clinic in Bersivy1 camp clinic.

7. Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Kabarto2 IDP camp in Duhok governorate

The different surveys done among the IDPs in the different camps in Duhok governorate and especially those done by UNHCR are pointing to the fact that the vast majority of these people do not have the intention to return back to their original locations due to many reasons of which the destruction of the infrastructure and the instability of the security situation are of the top causes. This fact has put the local authorities and the humanitarian community to give priority to sustain the service provision within the already existing camps so as to avoid any gap in this regard.

Kabarto2 IDPs camp in Semel district of Duhok governorate is of the apparent examples of this situation, and since the DOH Duhok did not have enough resources to provide the necessary support beyond this date, for this reason, Heevie started the running Kabarto2 camp PHCC in April 2019 to provide the full package primary health care services to the camp population which are more than 13,000 people.

This project is implemented by the support of WHO and during the year 2020, around **(30,326)** patients got benefit from the services provided within Heevie static clinic in Kabarto2 camp clinic.

9. Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Ashti IDP camp in Sulaymaniyah governorate

Despite the termination of the wars and crises in many regions throughout Iraq, the negative outcomes of these crises are still continuing, this include the existence of large numbers of IDPs in different regions, including the three governorates in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq, Erbil, Duhok and Sulaymaniyah, where thousands of displaced people are habiting more than 20 camps built specifically for this purpose these governorates. The provision of basic life support services, involving the primary health care services, to those IDPs, is largely beyond the limited capacities in the three governorates. In this regard, Heevie organization is providing the primary health care services to the IDPs in multiple camps, including Ashti camp in Sulaymaniyah governorate, which is habited by Yezidi populations and also many of the IDPs from Ninewa, Diyala and Saladdin governorates. The services involved also providing specialized laboratory services and ultrasound tests.

Among the multiple camps that have been established in Dohuk governorate early during the period of the war against ISIS and the associated crises, was Rwanga (Qadiya) IDP camp. This camp hosts thousands of the displaced people from different religious backgrounds, mostly from the Yazidi religious minority, who were displaced from Sinjar district.

The issue of the sustaining the provision of the basic life support services to the different groups of the vulnerable populations including the IDPs in various camp locations is being one of the most challenging issues facing the humanitarian community and local authorities, mostly due to the limited abilities to ensure the necessary financial resources to support these activities. Based on what has been mentioned, the health care service provision is facing an obvious risk of interruption being subjected to impending gaps any time. In order to avoid any possible gap in the primary health care services provision in Rwanga camp, Heevie Organization has started its project to run the PHCC in the camp by June 1st, 2020. Among the services being provided are the curative and preventive services, psychological support services, health education, Growth monitoring, reproductive health, vaccinations, dental and laboratory services.

The project is continuous by the support of WHO and the total number of consultations during the period between June and December 2020 was around **(23,927)** patients

12. Project: Primary healthcare service provision through Heevie Static three non-camp locations in Ninawa governorate

Among the conflict affected areas in Ninawa governorate was Tilkef district, which is by its nature habited by people from different ethnic and religious backgrounds, mainly of Yezidi and Christian minorities. The people in these regions were all displaced in the first few years of crises as their regions were near the fire lines and were in the focus of many military operations. After their areas were retaken, the people started to return back, and they are in a real need for establishing and sustaining the basic life support services involving the health care services.

Through one of its important projects, Heevie has provided the access to the primary health care services to the vulnerable people in the three locations of Hatara, Sireska and Doghata sub districts in Tilkef district of Ninawa governorate through a project supported by UNOCHA starting from January 2020 and for the period of 9 months. This came as a continuation of an already existing Heevie activity for supporting the health service provision in the targeted locations through its Mobile Medical Clinics to help avoiding the expected gap may be left behind in the health sector. This gap was covered by the Heevie project and the facilities were handed over to the directorate of health in Ninawa governorate by the end of the project.

13. Project: Providing the Physical Rehabilitation Services for IDPs in Duhok governorate

As a continuation for its program to provide and support physiotherapy and the medical rehabilitation activities in Duhok governorate and after establishing Heevie Center for Physiotherapy and Medical Rehabilitation by the support of WHO, Heevie started its new project for the providing the medical rehabilitation services within this center mainly for the IDPs and refugees. The center is active daily for 8 hours (9:00 – 18:00) and is supported with the necessary medical and administrative staff to do the required activities.

The center is named as (Heevie Physiotherapy Center) and an agreement has been signed with the DOH Duhok allowing Heevie to provide physical rehabilitation services within the center for the coming period. The project has started by the first of November 2019 and is continuous till now.

Around (111) patients were provided with the assistive devices in 2020

14. Project: Providing access to the mental and psychosocial support services for the vulnerable populations in Erbil governorate

The continuous wars and conflicts in Iraq for the last few years have not only physically influenced the people in the affected areas, but also affected the mental and the psychological aspects in an even more prominent way. The undesirable psychosocial outcomes of the successive crises on the vulnerable population are becoming more apparent every day, affecting on the individual, family and the community level as well.

In an effort to fill the apparent gap regarding mental and psychosocial support service provision, Heevie started implementing a project aiming to provide safe, free and equitable access to the mental and psychosocial support services for the vulnerable populations in two locations within Erbil governorate, which are Debaga IDPs camp and Kalak sub district. The project has started by the 1st of December 2019 by the support of WHO and is continuous till this moment. The project involves providing the necessary interventional procedures for managing (treating and curing) the mental health and psychosocial problems through a well trained staff targeting the conflict and crises affected population from IDPs, returnees and host community in both mentioned locations.

16. Project: Psychosocial support services within Heevie projects In Camps (Shariya, Mam rash, Jadaa3, Bersivy 1, Kabarto2, Ashti, Tilkef and Rwanga)

The psychosocial support and mental health care services are among the fundamental services that should be involved in any response plan for the health needs and requirements of the vulnerable populations. Heevie has paid the necessary attention to this topic aiming to fill the existing gap in this regard, which in addition to running specialized centers for this purpose; the PSS have been engaged in nearly all the static clinics of Heevie in the different camps and non-camp locations.

In its projects of running the main camps clinics, Heevie is providing the psychosocial support services to the beneficiaries through well trained staff from doctors and social workers in nearly all the static camp and non-camp locations. The management and treatment provided is the individual psychotherapy sessions, group therapy and the medication allowed to be given on this level with referral services to the higher levels for more complex cases. Heevie will continue doing the necessary capacity building for its staff regarding the mental health care services to help addressing and responding to the increasing needs of the affected people in this field.

17. Project: Health promotion/ education within Heevie projects In Camps (Shariya, Mam rash, Bersivy 1, Kabarto2, Ashti, Tilkef and Rwanga)

Due to their importance in the curative and preventive fields, the health education and promotion activities are becoming an important component of the health care programs, this is especially important during the conflicts and crises to help avoiding the outbreaks and endemics and also to provide the necessary orientation for the vulnerable populations regarding the different health needs and programs and the variety of risks on the individual and community health.

Based on these facts, all the static clinics managed by Heevie Organization are provided with the special staff from community health workers staff along with the necessary elements and tools to perform the health promotion activities. This specific element of the health program will be further expanded during 2021 to cover more locations and to have better qualified staff.

During the year 2020, total number of health promotion sessions conducted within Heevie projects reached (5,746), and number of people attended health promotion sessions or visited by health promotion teams was (47,775) persons as shown below:

18.Renovation of Erbil East Emergency Hospital

Erbil East Emergency Hospital is one of the major health facilities in Erbil governorate, being an important secondary and tertiary center and of the referral and drainage points for most of these services for the whole Erbil governorate, in addition to many areas in the nearby governorates of Kirkuk and Ninewa especially during the last few years of wars and instability. The increasing load and pressure on the facility from the growing needs of the beneficiaries is a challenging issue for the local health authorities, and make it obligatory to improve the service provision in the hospital through providing it with the needed capacity to deal with these needs.

As an effort to support Erbil East Emergency Hospital, Heevie Organization, and by the support of WHO, has implemented a project for performing renovation and rehabilitation of the hospital through increasing the capacity of the hospital regarding the space, patients' management and patient admission abilities.

19. Renovation of Sulaymaniyah Burn and Plastic Surgery Hospital


The health facilities in Sulaymaniyah governorate, as it is the case in most of the facilities in Kurdistan Region, are under huge pressure. This is attributed in part to the increasing numbers population and beneficiaries, as in addition to the host community, they are providing services to the IDPs and refugees as well, and from other side, to the big financial crises in KRI and Iraq as a whole, an issue that limits the ability of these facilities to respond to the needs of the beneficiaries and accommodate with them. Sulaymaniyah Burn and Plastic Surgery hospital is one of the oldest hospitals in Sulaymaniya, established more than 90 years ago. It is providing the services for different victims of wide ranges of accidents (mainly burns) in addition to the performing the plastic and reconstructive surgical interventions for the patients with congenital and acquired deformities and malformations. The increasing load and pressure on the facility from the growing needs of the beneficiaries, in addition to the exhausted facility building, make it obligatory to improve the service provision in the hospital through supporting the different branches and departments in the hospital.

As an effort to support Sulaymaniyah Burn and Plastic Surgery Hospital, Heevie Organization, and by the support of WHO, has implemented a project for performing renovation and rehabilitation of the hospital through performing rehabilitation and renovation of the surgical halls and improving their capacity and also the infection control procedures.

20. Establishing a Specialized Center for Treating and Isolating the COVID-19 Patients in Khabat District Erbil Governorate

As a part of Heevie projects and activities to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic and to provide the best management and treatment methods for the patients, Heevie Organization established a specialized center for treating and isolating the COVID-19 patients in Khabat district of Erbil Governorate. The center includes 14 patient admission wards with single or two beds maximum, with a total of more than 20 beds, each bed equipped with all necessary equipment with a central oxygen system. The center is also provided with pharmacy and laboratory departments in addition to special rooms for dressing, staff rest and exchange.

The project is implemented directly by Heevie engineering department with the support of the World Health Organization.



21.Project: Emergency response to strengthen local health systems in three IDP camps in Dohuk, Kurdistan Iraq (from 1st January – 30st September 2020) Funded by FARMAMUNDI

Heevie Organization continued supporting the local healthcare system through implementing new project covering the health gaps in IDP camps in Duhok governorate, in this field, and by the support and through a partnership with FARMAMUNDI NGO from Spain, Heevie implemented a special project for supporting three IDP Camps in Duhok namely Shariya, Kabarto2 and Bersivy1 Camps for the period of 9 months (1.1.2020-30.9.2020).

The support involved three main activities: -

- Procurement of medications for Shariya Camp clinic for the period of 6 months.
- Procurement a provision of medical supplies and consumable for three camp locations.
- Health awareness and education activities in three camps.

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22. Project: Health Capacity Building

Due to the rapid progress in the health and medical field, continuous educations and development for the medical staff is needed. In an attempt to fill the existing gaps in the capacity building programs in the region, Heevie Organization is supporting Duhok General Directorate of Health in a long term program to maintain and improve the necessary resources for provision of the quality health care services in various facilities, hospitals and specialized centers belonging to the directorate.

This program comes after Heevie teams performed the required assessments to determine the shortages and needs existed within different DOH Duhok facilities. Heevie project is aiming to improve the skills and abilities of the health staff, and also develop and improve the interference mechanisms and the treatment and management protocols within different health facilities according to the below mechanisms:

1. Training and capacity building of the health care service providers from different branches and specialties.
2. Filling the gap regarding the shortage of staff of the health facilities which is done in coordination with the DOH through various mechanisms to respond to the increasing needs especially of the newly established facilities.
3. Management of patients with congenital anomalies, especially the congenital heart diseases, through providing the required medical care and management in addition to the special surgical treatment for selected cases who are in need for delicate surgical intervention in Italy.

The implementation of this project started early in 2018, and continues in this year through the below mentioned activities:

- 1- Supporting the staff of the Neonatal ICU of Heevi Pediatrics Teaching Hospital and ICU and CCU of Azadi teaching hospital.
- 2- Training courses for the medical staff in Italy.
- 3- Training courses for the doctors in both Cardiac Catheterization and Vascular Surgery.

The number of health staff supported/ trained: **(56)** persons.

Other Activities in 2020

1. COVID-19 prevention activities

Along with the current situation in the region regarding the risk of Corona Virus Infection and due to the important role of the protection regulations in preventing this highly infectious disease, Heevie Organization is applying strict regulations in all its projects to help protecting the staff and the beneficiaries from the infection. This is done through providing the Personal Protection Equipment's PPE for the staff working in all the statics involving masks, gowns, gloves and other requirements, in addition to the disinfectants and sterilization materials. Heevie also did a complete sterilization for all its facilities with regular provision of the sterilization solution and cleaning solution and supplies to do regular cleaning work on daily basis.

With all these lines, Heevie is assuring participation of most of its staff in the training and awareness courses regulated by the DoH and the different partners to get the better knowledge regarding dealing with the current situation and also applying the standard rules in their daily work and activities regarding the disease prevention.

Heevie has also directed all the health education and awareness staff in the different camps to concentrate on awareness about the prevention of Corona through providing regular sessions for the clinics' visitors and also through tent to tent visits to reach the maximum numbers of beneficiaries.

2. Renovation of Hatara, Serishka and Doghata PHCCs buildings in Tarkaif district

Heevie Organization is implementing a project by the support of UNOCHA under IHF for supporting the primary health care service provision in Hatara, Serishka and Doghata sub districts of Tarkaif district in Ninewa governorate. The targeted locations are of the return areas and of the regions badly affected during the war against ISIS, and are currently under served due to the limited capacity of the DOH Ninewa.

The populations in these locations are mainly of the Yezidi and Christian minorities, who have been displaced several times during the last few years. These facts have added extra value for the project as its will respond to the needs of the people until the DOH will be able to provide the services.

Due to the war circumstances, as well as the lack of the necessary financial resources, the PHCCs in the mentioned sub districts have been affected in a way made them ineligible to provide the health care services. For this reason, Heevie started a process of renovation for the buildings of these centers. The renovation involved building rehabilitation, electricity works, water and sanitary works and provision of the furniture.

The different steps of the work involved the below mentioned actions:

3. Renovation of Qadiya Health Center in Rwanga IDPs Camp

Heevie Organization with the support of WHO is implementing a health project for providing primary health care services in Rwanga Camp at Sumel district in Duhok governorate. The project includes a big number of IDPs who fled from areas that were badly affected during the war against ISIS. The Yazidi minority and Muslims forms the largest proportion of the population of the affected areas and many families were displaced during last few years. Heevie organization, within this project aims to support department of health and local health authorities to upgrade the level of health services in this camp, and that through the following:

1. Maintenance and cleaning of the health center building from the inside and outside to make it suitable for providing medical and treatment services
2. Providing financial resources and necessary logistics to organize the necessary health programs such as mental health, health awareness, nutrition, etc.
3. Add the incomplete medical staff and especially the doctors to be present on a daily basis in this center
4. Giving trainings to medical staff in all departments of the center (mental health, health awareness, pharmacy and nurses)
5. Providing the center with medicines and medical supplies

Heevie started implementing this project on 1/6/2020 with the support of the World Health Organization. The maintenance of the center building began on the date mentioned and maintenance process included the maintenances of the building and the extension of electricity and water works in addition to the provision of furniture.

As a start and preparation for the project, the organization took the procedures listed below:

- To fix and dye the edges of the affected building
- Preparing the pharmacy room suitable for the pharmaceutical work with the shelves of the medicines and medical supplies
- Maintenance and re-operation of the chair and the tools of the Dentist's Clinic
- Repairing the doors and windows
- Placing curtains for all 25 windows
- Providing equipment and medical equipment
- Renovation of existing furniture with the addition of furniture as needed such as chairs, cupboards and tapers
- Refill the fire extinguishers in the center and redistributing them as needed
- Providing a suggestion box and the organization's telephone hotline
- Re-arranging the center's garden and afforesting it.
- Set up a separate blood drawing room for the laboratory, and equip it with the necessary needs and provide a refrigerator and a washbasin for the center's laboratory
- Renovation and maintenance of electrical and water pipes.



5. Opening Ceremony of Heevie Center for Physiotherapy and Medical Rehabilitation

On Tuesday, 18/2/2020, in the presence of the World Health Organization representative in Iraq Dr. Adham Rashad Ismail, and the Director General of DOH Dohuk, Dr. Nezar Ismat, in addition to the representatives of many NGOs and other entities, an in a special ceremony, Heevie Center for Physiotherapy and Medical Rehabilitation was opened. The aforementioned center is located in the Tanahi complex of Semel district and will provide physical rehabilitation services for the IDPs, refugees and host community in the governorate



6. Opening Ceremony of Sulaymaniyah Burn and Plastic Surgery hospital

As a part of Heevie activities for supporting the local healthcare system, on Monday 23/11/2020, and in the presence of Dr. Adham Ismail, the Representative of the World Health Organization in Iraq, and Dr. Sabah Hawrami, the Director General, DoH Sulaymaniyah, the WHO, Ministry of Health and Heevie Organization celebrated the completion of the renovation and rehabilitation works in Sulaymaniyah Burn and Plastic Surgery hospital.

The project involved a complete renovation of three surgical operation rooms and theatres in the hospital with further expansion of the department through adding a fourth surgical room, all well-equipped and supported with the needed machines and furniture. These added to the establishment of a disinfection unit and also a staff resting room.

Heevie took in consideration using the optimum standards in the refurbishment process and performing the highest quality works and the best quality materials. The project implemented directly by Heevie Organization through the support of the World Health Organization, and is expected to upgrade the capacity of the hospital to deal with more complex cases and perform more surgical interventions.



7. Opening Ceremony of East Erbil Emergency Hospital

On Tuesday, 24/11/2020, and in the presence of Dr. Adham Ismail, the Representative of the World Health Organization in Iraq, a special ceremony was held to celebrate the Heevie project for renovation and expansion of East Erbil Emergency Hospital. The project involved building renovation works and refurbishing of the in-patient wards and intensive care units with installation of a total of 57 horizontal bed head units with related accessories and equipment from the oxygen system pipeline, medical gas, and suction system. The project implemented directly by Heevie Organization through the support of the World Health Organization, and comes as a part of a number of Heevie projects for supporting the local and host community health facilities, that are providing the healthcare services for the different populations from the host community, IDPs and refugees and are by that under huge pressure and suffering from apparent gaps due to shortage of resources. Erbil East Emergency hospital is currently the main emergency health service provider for whole the city as the other hospitals have been specified for the management and treatment of COVID-19 patients.



8. Visits by formal delegations for Heevie projects

During the last period, the field visits of the different parties to the projects of Heevie Organization were continued in various locations, during which the visiting delegations expressed their high appreciation for what Heevie is providing through its projects and also for its adherence to optimal standards in the process of provision the best health services to the beneficiaries. Below is an overview of the official visits of some of these delegations to Heevie projects.

- On Monday, 10/19/2020, a high delegation from the World Health Organization visited some of the projects of the Heevie organization in Dohuk Governorate, including the following:

The aforementioned delegation visited Heevie primary health care center in the Bersivy1 IDP camp in the Zakho district, where the organization provides the full package of primary health care services to the displaced population in the camp. The delegation had a short round on the center's departments, was briefed on the progress of work, met with the working staff and sought out the opinions of some the clinic visitors about the quality of the services provided.



- The delegation also visited the primary health center of Heevie organization in Rwanga IDPs in Dohuk governorate, where they were oriented about the progress of service provision and the quality of services provided to the displaced in the aforementioned camp



- The delegation concluded its visit to Heevie projects of by visiting the Heevie Center for Physiotherapy and Medical Rehabilitation in the Tanahi Complex in Dohuk governorate



9. Distributing Equipment on Newborn Children in IDPs Camp

On Wednesday 15.7.2020 Heevie Organization distributed Kits on newborn children, each kit contains of (Baby Diapers, Blanket, soducream, baby soap, bath sheet)

It is worth to mention, that Medair Organization provided these materials, and this distribution was according to Heevie Health Centers need and demand in Duhok Governorate IDP camps.

10. Supporting the local health facilities

As a result of the continuous crises in the region along with the limited financial resources and also the huge pressure on the health sector, the local health facilities are finding major obstacles and difficulties in its trial to optimally respond to the needs of the beneficiary populations from the host community, IDPs and refugees. As part of Heevie efforts to help fill potential gaps in relation to medicines and medical supplies in these facilities, the organization regularly donates various quantities of medications and medical supplies to different hospitals and health centers belonging to the directorates of health in the different governorates.



11. Medical Doctor working at Heevie Organization saved the life of a newborn baby in Ashti camp/ Al-Sulaymaniyah

Dr. Rosa Muhammad Sabir, the medical doctor working at Heevie static clinic at Ashti IDPs camp in Sulaymaniyah, saved the life of a newborn baby in the first few days of his life suffering from neonatal jaundice exceeding 26 mg/dl, exposing the baby serious problems involving brain injury, Cerebral Palsy and even death, if not treated within few hours. To treat this condition, the baby may be in need of blood exchange transfusion, followed by Phototherapy, which treatment modalities available only at the hospitals, and since the secondary and tertiary health facilities in Sulaymaniyah are not operating with her full capacity as due to the strike of the health staff and the non-availability of the specialized staff for such procedures at the central Pediatrics hospital in Sulaymaniyah, Dr. Rosa herself accompanied the baby to the hospital by the ambulance and underwent the necessary management for him and remained with the patient until the degree of jaundice became 20 mg/dl, a level at which the possibility of the serious problems disappears. The baby was discharged from the hospital after the necessary treatment and follow-up, and she is currently in a good situation with her family.
