



Activities and Projects of the year 2019

During the year 2019, Heevie Organization continued implementing its projects and activities aiming to provide the humanitarian assistance to the people in need throughout the country. Heevie was able to respond to the health and medical needs of (449,026) patients through various projects covered multiple locations in different areas involving the crisis and war affected regions.

The services provided were on the primary, secondary and tertiary health care levels. The primary health care services provided were both in curative and preventive and involved clinical examination, treatment, reproductive health services, mental health, psychosocial support, nutrition, vaccination, dental, laboratory, ultrasound, minor surgeries, health education and promotion and referral services to the secondary and higher health care centers.

On the secondary and tertiary levels, Heevie continued its program for treating children with congenital heart diseases in addition to the activities for supporting MOH facilities and capacity building for the local medical staff.

Heevie, as an active member of the national and local health cluster, continued participating actively in different meetings, workshops and committees with an optimum coordination with the local health authorities and international parties.

1. Treating Patients and Training the Local Medical staff in cooperation with Italian organizations

One of the main and most important projects of Heevie organization is providing the best treatment and management opportunities for the patients suffering from difficult diseases; this is done through a well-organized program implemented in coordination with the Italian hospitals, centers and organizations. Through this project, which is active since 2006, Heevie is providing the necessary medical assistance and treatment for children with various diseases and organ malformations through the surgical intervention and other treatment and management modalities. The treated cases involved children with congenital heart diseases, renal and genital systems malformations, malignancies, blood disorders and others.

Hundreds of children with various medical and surgical problems were sent to Italy to be treated both medically and surgically according to the need. This was done by the support of the KRI government and in coordination with the Italian partners. After establishment of the local health infrastructure in a way being ready to support the program activities, specialized Italian teams started to visit KRI according to a regular schedule, usually, a minimum of 4 missions/ year were performed during which more than 200 operations were done (50 operations per each mission).

The last crises and security instability in Iraq made the Italian teams unable to visit the country; as a solution for that and instead, Heevie used to collect the most acute patients and send them to Italy for operations. Total number of patients underwent surgical interventions in Italy during the year 2019 are (9) patients. Efforts are ongoing by Heevie to resume the program in Iraq through regulating new missions for the Italian teams according to the needs and gaps.

Heevie got benefit from the specialized Italian teams during their regular visits to the region to do capacity building for the local staff involving them in the overall all steps of the program and management steps and procedures. This was done through implementing training programs for the local staff on the different topics related to the surgical interventions such as preparation of the patients for the surgical operations, post-operative follow up and care, ICU monitoring, treatment of complications and performing various medical and surgical procedures. The program also involved training of the doctors (mainly pediatricians) on Echocardiography examination for the patients with congenital heart diseases in Italy. The project of treating patients and training the local medical staff was implemented by the support of many partners and donors especially the Italian organizations, hospitals and centers, American embassy at Baghdad and other donors.

2.Project: Registering and examining the Congenital Heart Diseases Children in Kurdistan Region

The large number of the children suffering from the heart diseases and the non-availability of the necessary interventional methods urged Heevie to develop a strict program for providing the required assistance to those patients. This was done in cooperation with SIA Italian NGO and through it Heevie took the initiative and involved building up and establishing a data base for the patients Congenital Heart Diseases in KRI and Iraq. Through this project, Heevie Organization is doing a regular documentation for all the possible cases of congenital heart diseases to make their information ready and available if any treatment or intervention modality required.

This is one of the first and most active Heevie programs and is having a great impact on the outcomes of these diseases and the life style of the patients. The program involved training of the doctors (mainly pediatricians) on Echocardiography examination for the patients with congenital heart diseases in Italy, in addition to providing Echocardiography machines for the main hospitals and centers in Duhok, Erbil and Sulaymaniyah. During 2019, Heevie has so far added 370 cases of children with congenital heart diseases to its existing data base.

3.Project: Mobile Medical Clinics

The unstable security situation and non-availability of the health infrastructure and medical staff in many regions especially in the conflict affected areas made Heevie organization expanding the activities of its Mobile Medical Clinics to reach the higher possible number of vulnerable populations in different war and crises affected areas.

Through the long time working with the mobile hospitals and clinics which is exceeding 17 years, Heevie has obtained the necessary expert and experience in running them; this long period had led to accumulation of expertise among Heevie administrative and medical staff. From the early beginning of the project, Heevie mobile clinics were covering the far-away villages and districts lacking the health facilities, after the events of the year 2014 and the subsequent wars and crises in the region, Heevie directed its MMCs to serve the vulnerable populations from IDPs, returnees and host communities in the conflict affected regions. This involved providing the primary health care services to various camp and non-camp locations in coordination the directorates of health in Duhok Ninawa and Erbil and also the health sub-clusters in the corresponding governorates and the humanitarian actors.

Heevie activated five Mobile Medical Clinics to provide the health care services in the targeted locations, two of them allocated for Tilkef district of Ninawa governorate in addition the non-camp locations in Duhok governorate, and three allocated for Talafar district. All Heevie MMCs are performing their activities by the support of WHO.




4. Project: Community Health Houses

The inadequate financial resources, shortage of the medical staff and non-availability of medications and medical equipment were of the reasons behind lacking of majority of villages and small towns in many regions across Iraq especially in Ninawa governorate for health facilities. This specific entity deprived the community from the minimum coverage by the primary health care services.

In an effort to fill this gap, Heevie started a wide assessment process for the region aiming to build up a strong skeleton of health facilities able respond to the needs of the populations in these regions to provide them with the needed health care services. Here was the idea of establishing the “Community Health Houses”. The project started in 2016 and was started by putting prefab buildings and doing the necessary rehabilitation and renovation of others in more than 18 villages in Ninewa governorate. The following step was recruiting the medical staff and procuring the necessary medication and medical equipment and supplies to let them be ready for the service provision, the staff is selected mostly from the same locations after the necessary training was performed.

The villages supported within the project have shown some changes due to the events in the region, the overall villages served during the different time periods of the projects reached around 18 locations. The project of Community Health Houses was implemented by the support of WHO in coordination with DOH Duhok. It served a total population of 25,430 people, during the December 2018 and first three months of the year 2019, about 18,127 patients have received the treatment within the project.

Heevie organization has provided on the site curative health services in 13 villages with CHH project during 2019, including: Masaka, Kalhe, Shebana, Ein Jheshiya, Tal Musa, Aliyouka, Che Khire, Sahal Hamad, Tal Khidher, Kubane, Derstone, Tal Adas and Badrike villages in Talaafar and Tilkef Districts.

After stabilization of the condition on the ground and with the relatively better ability of the DOH to respond to the needs of the population in the locations served by Heevie project of Community Health Houses, Heevie handed over these facilities to the DOH Ninawa.

5. Project: Equitable access to full package primary health care services for IDPs within Heevie static clinics at Shariya and Mam Rash IDP camps in Duhok and Ninawa governorates

More than 30,000 IDPs are habiting Mam Rash and Shariya camps for which Heevie organization is providing the health services through its static clinics. Heevie did its best to assure providing the full package primary health care services in both locations, and for this purpose, the organization continued coordinating and communicating different partners and donor to keep the high-quality service provision in both locations.

The support for both clinics activities passed through different phases according to the donor. During the period from October 2018 to April 2019 the support was from WHO through a project to support both locations together, after this period, the two PHCCs were engaged in a single project along with many other facilities through a project supported by WHO as well.

During the time period covered with this project, around (70,225) patients got benefit from the services provided in the two targeted locations and as follows:

6.Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Mam Rash IDP camp in Ninawa governorate.

Mam Rash IDPs camp in Shekhan district of Ninawa has the capacity of hosting around 10,000 people; it was established originally to gather the IDPs habiting the non- camp locations and unfinished buildings throughout Duhok governorate. As a response to the health needs of the IDPs in the Mam Rash, Heevie established its static PHCC in the camp to provide the necessary health care services. Heevie clinic is providing the full package primary health care services with multiple health programs aiming to give the opportunity for the beneficiaries to have an easy, safe and free access to the health care service and minimize the need to seek the services elsewhere since the camp is far from the main MOH facilities and it is difficult for the its population to travel to the secondary facilities, by this, Heevie is decreasing the load on these facilities also. The camp clinic is currently serving more than 8,800 IDPs as direct beneficiaries in addition to many others from the villages surrounding the camp.

Heevie support for the clinic has been passed through multiple phases and time periods according to the donors, mainly WHO, during the period of the project between May and December 2019, around (35,761) patients have visited the clinic and received various treatments and interventions.

7.Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Shariya IDP camp in Ninawa governorate.

Shariya IDPs camp is of the biggest camps in Duhok governorate, the camp has the capacity of hosting 18,000 people. As a continuation for its programs to serve the IDPs in Duhok governorate, Heevie Organization is running the PHCC within the camp leading to a valuable progress and development in the health service provision in the camp.

Multiple medical specialties are involved in the clinic staff skeleton as a step from Heevie aiming to respond to nearly all the needs of the beneficiaries in the camp, this involved internist, pediatrician, general surgeon, obstetrician, urologist and ENT specialist, in addition to the dental and ultrasound services.

The project implementation has been passed through multiple phases and time periods according to the donors. The time period between October 2018 and April 2019, Heevie support for the clinic was in a single project involving both Shariya and Mam Rash locations. After this period, the location was involved in a comprehensive project involving multiple camps and facilities. During this period (33,164) patients got benefit from the services provided within the camp clinic.


8.Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Bersivy1 IDP camp in Duhok governorate

Bersivy1 IDPs camp is among the multiple camps in Duhok governorate hosting thousands of displaced people mostly from the Yezidi religious minority from Sinjar district who were displaced early during the war against ISIS in 2014. Duhok governorate, with its all service provision sectors and through the special board formed for this purpose (BRHA, Board of Relieve and Humanitarian Affairs), have done their best to provide the necessary assistance and aid for the vulnerable populations from the IDPs. Among the important services needed to be covered were the health care services, for which Heevie has started the service provision through its static clinics in many camps to provide the health care services for the IDPs involving about 6,000 IDPs in Bersivy1 camp. Heevie is providing the full package primary health care services in its clinic in Bersivy1 camp involving the curative and preventive care, psychosocial support, health promotion, growth monitoring, reproductive health, vaccination, dental care, laboratory and ultrasound services. The clinic is active 24/7 aiming to respond to the maximum needs if the beneficiaries.

During the year 2019, around (43,322) patients got benefit from the services provided within Heevie static clinic in Bersivy1 camp clinic.

9. Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Kabarto2 IDP camp in Duhok governorate


The different surveys done among the IDPs habiting the different camps in Duhok governorate and especially those done by UNHCR are pointing to the fact that the vast majority of these people do not have the intention to return back to their original locations due to many reasons of which the destruction of the infrastructure and the instability of the security situation are of the top causes. This fact has put the local authorities and the humanitarian community to give priority to sustain the service provision within the already existing camps so as to avoid any gap in this regard.

Kabarto2 IDPs camp in Semel district of Duhok governorate is of the apparent examples of this situation since the previous support for the health service provision in the camp was expired in March 2019 and the DOH Duhok did not have enough resources to provide the necessary support beyond this date, for this reason, Heevie started the running Kabarto2 camp PHCC in April 2019 to provide the full package primary health care services to the camp population which are more than 13,000 people. This project is implemented by the support of WHO.

During the period of the project between April and December 2019, around (33,106) patients got benefit from the services provided within Heevie static clinic in Kabarto2 camp clinic.

10. Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Jadaa3 IDP camp in Ninawa governorate

Ninawa governorate and Mosul city specifically, stayed around four years under the control of ISIS, and during this period, it has been through multiple wars, crises and conflicts, leading to multiple negative physical and mental impacts on the people remained under ISIS control. After the decision was made to liberate Mosul city, preparations were done to control the unwanted outcomes of the military intervention. Many camps were established to receive the expected huge waves OF IDPs, among which was Jadaa3 camp in Gayara district which had the capacity to host around 11,000 people mostly from the west bank of Mosul which is nearly totally destroyed so the displaced people find difficulties in returning back.

With movement of the displaced people to the camp, Heevie established its static clinic to respond to their health needs by providing the primary health care services 24/7.

By the end of 2019 and following the return process of many of the camp populations to their original places, Ninawa governorate decided to relocate the remaining camp IDPs in specific camp locations, by this the people of Jadaa 1,2 and 3 camps were moved to one camp (Jadaa1) and the camp of Jadaa3 was closed.

Heevie handed over the component of its health facility in Jadaa3 camp to the DOH Ninawa as a gift to get benefit from it in other locations according to the need.

Heevie Jadaa3 camp clinic project was supported by WHO and during the year 2019 till the end of October almost (32,657) patients have received the treatment within the clinic.

11. Project: Primary health care services within Heevie static clinic in Al-Salamyiah 1 IDP camp in Ninawa governorate

Al-Salamyiah1 camp was of the many camps established after the operations for liberating Mosul city were started to receive the large numbers of the displaced people from the city and the surrounding locations. Heevie started running its static clinic in the camp early in April 2019 to respond to the different health needs of the camp habitants. This project implemented by the support of WHO and was planned to extend to cover the rest of the year 2019, but due to the decision of the governorate and the government, Al-Sallamiyah1 was reconciled with the nearby Al-Sallamiyah2 camp, Heevie closed its clinic in Al-Salamiya1 and donated the facility and its contents to DoH Ninawa.

The total number of patients received treatment within Al-Salamyiah1 camp clinic during 2019 was (39,169) patients.

Heevie Organization continued its efforts to provide the health care services for different groups of vulnerable population in the camps and non-camp locations involving the conflict affected region. In this field, Heevie started its project of providing the primary health care services for the IDPs habiting Hassan Sham U2 camp in Al-Hamdaniya district of Ninawa governorate.

The camp is consisted of 1500 tents and has the capacity of hosting more than 9,000 people. The project is continuous and is implemented by the support of WHO.

Total number of patients got benefit from the services provided within Heevie static clinic at Hassan Sham U2 camp during the project period between December 1st 2018 to end of the year 2019 reached (29,465) patients as shown in the table below:

13. Project: Primary health care services for IDPs within Heevie static clinic at Mamilyan Camp in Duhok governorates

Mamilyan IDPs camp in Akre district was among the camps established to receive the increasing displaced families from Ninawa governorate after the operations for liberating Mosul city from under ISIS control were started. In an effort to prevent any gap formation in the mentioned camp, Heevie started running its static clinic to serve the population remained in the camp after the return of many of them since the situation was settled and the security situation was stabilized in their places of origin.

Heevie activities in the camp started late during 2018 by a direct support from Heevie, and the total number of patients got benefit from the services provided from the project services till the end of February 2019 were (1,348) patients, the break down is shown in the below table.

14. Project: Supporting the physiotherapy and the medical rehabilitation activities in Duhok governorate.

With cessation of violence and of the stabilization of the overall condition in different war-affected areas in Iraq and after the return process of the displaced people to their original places, priority is given to more specialized health care services and on the higher levels to respond to the needs of different vulnerable populations from all age groups. In this field, care for the disabled persons, amputees and severely wounded people is of the main priorities. As a continuation for these efforts, and from the year 2017, Heevie Organization started its project for supporting physiotherapy and the medical rehabilitation activities in Duhok governorate through the following steps:

- A. Establishing a Medical Rehabilitation Center for IDPs in Duhok governorate
- B. Supporting Duhok Specialized Center for Rheumatic Diseases and Medical Rehabilitation by
 - Extension of the service provision hours daily for the evening time 4 hours/ day
 - Provision of Raw materials for the prosthetic limbs
- C. Capacity building and training of 21 the physiotherapists in Italy
- D. Community outreach to treat the handicapped and disabled people.
- E. Provision of assistive devices
- F. Providing a special car for transporting the patients with disabilities from their houses to rehabilitation centers and the different health facilities to receive the necessary treatment and interventions.

The different aspects of physical rehabilitation activities are supported by Heevie and WHO.

- (204) patients were provided with the assistive devices in 2019
- (8,450) patients have received physiotherapy Sessions in medical rehabilitation Duhok specialized center as shown in table1

15.Project: Establishing a medical rehabilitation center for IDPs in Duhok governorate

Following a proper assessment of the needs and gaps in the field of physiotherapy and medical rehabilitation in Duhok governorate, it was observed that there is a critical shortage of the necessary facilities for providing such services. In the whole governorate, there is only one specialized center for the rheumatic diseases and medical rehabilitation, which is currently, as many of the other secondary health center, providing the services to the host community, IDPs and refugees, an issue leading to huge pressure and burden on the center.

Based on that and after the proper conversation and negotiations with the directorate on health and Duhok governorate, it was agreed to establish a Medical Rehabilitation Center for the IDPs in the governorate supported with the required equipment, machines and supplies to provide the physical rehabilitation services for the disabled people and the people with special needs from IDPs within different camp and non-camp locations in Duhok governorate.

For this purpose, Heevie has agreed with the directorate general of Health and Duhok governorate to get benefit from an old non-used building belonging to the DOH after doing the necessary rehabilitation and adjustments to make it suitable for the physical and medical rehabilitation activities. The building selected is located in Tanahi complex of Semel district which is a central access point for more than 100,000 IDPs and also an easily accessible location for the all the IDPs in the governorate.

16. Project: Providing the Physical Rehabilitation Services for IDPs in Duhok governorate

As a continuation for its program to provide and support physiotherapy and the medical rehabilitation activities in Duhok governorate and after establishing Heevie Center for Physiotherapy and Medical Rehabilitation by the support of WHO, Heevie started its new project for the providing the medical rehabilitation services within this center mainly for the IDPs and refugees. The center is active daily for 8 hours (9:00 – 18:00) and is supported with the necessary medical and administrative staff to do the required activities.

The center is named as (Heevie Physiotherapy Center) and an initial agreement has been signed with the DOH Duhok allowing Heevie to provide physical rehabilitation services within the center for the coming period. The project has started by the first of November 2019 and the center is open and available daily from 9:00 – 18:00.

17. Project: Providing access to the mental and psychosocial support services for the vulnerable populations in Erbil governorate

The continuous wars and conflicts in Iraq for the last few years have not only physically influenced the people in the affected areas, but also affected the mental and the psychological aspects in an even more prominent way. The undesirable psychosocial outcomes of the successive crises on the vulnerable population are becoming more apparent every day, affecting on the individual, family and the community level as well.

In an effort to fill the apparent gap regarding mental and psychosocial support service provision, Heevie started implementing a project aiming to provide safe, free and equitable access to the mental and psychosocial support services for the vulnerable populations in two locations within Erbil governorate, which are Debaga camp and Kalak sub district. The project will be for the period of 6 months starting from the 1st of December 2019 with possibility of extension.

The project involves providing the necessary interventional procedures for managing (treating and curing) the mental health and psychosocial problems through a well-trained staff targeting the conflict and crises affected population from IDPs, returnees and host community in both mentioned locations.

18. Project: Reproductive Health Care Services

Heevie paid the necessary attention for the health of the girls and women and more specifically those of childbearing age. In this regard, Heevie assured recruiting the female staff from doctors and nurses within all its projects to provide the reproductive health care services including antenatal care, post-natal care and family planning. Additional care for the women health was done through performing screening for breast cancer, education about the breast-feeding procedures and provision of the tonic medications.

The RH activities were implemented by the support of UNFPA for the first 6 months of 2019, and by a direct support from Heevie for the following period. Below are statistics of the reproductive health care services provided within Heevie projects for the year 2019:

19. Project: Psychosocial support services within Heevie projects In Camps (Shariya , Mam rash, Jadaa3, Bersivy 1, Kabarto2 and Al-Salamyiah1)

The psychosocial support and mental health care services are among the fundamental services that should be involved in any response plan for the health needs and requirements of the vulnerable populations. Heevie has paid the necessary attention to this topic aiming to fill the existing gap in this regard, which in addition to running specialized centers for this purpose; the PSS have been engaged in nearly all the static clinics of Heevie in the different camps and non-camp locations.

In its projects of running the main camps clinics, Heevie is providing the psychosocial support services to the beneficiaries through well trained staff from doctors and social workers in nearly all the static camp and non-camp locations. The management and treatment provided is the individual psychotherapy sessions, group therapy and the medication allowed to be given on this level with referral services to the higher levels for more complex cases. Heevie will continue doing the necessary capacity building for its staff regarding the mental health care services to help addressing and responding to the increasing needs of the affected people in this field.

Due to their importance in the curative and preventive fields, the health education and promotion activities are becoming an important component of the health care programs, this is especially important during the conflicts and crises to help avoiding the outbreaks and endemics and also to provide the necessary orientation for the vulnerable populations regarding the different health needs and programs and the variety of risks on the individual and community health.

Based on these facts, all the static clinics managed by Heevie Organization are provided with the special staff from community health workers staff along with the necessary elements and tools to perform the health promotion activities. This specific element of the health program will be further expanded during 2020 to cover more locations and to have better qualified staff.

During the year 2019, total number of health promotion sessions conducted within Heevie projects reached (2,398) , and number of people attended health promotion sessions or visited by health promotion teams was (88,265) persons as shown below:

22.Project: Health Capacity Building

Due to the rapid progress in the health and medical field, continuous educations and development for the medical staff is needed. In an attempt to fill the existing gaps in the capacity building programs in the region, Heevie Organization, in coordination with SIA Italian Organization, is supporting Duhok General Directorate of Health in a long term program to maintain and improve the necessary resources for provision of the quality health care services in various facilities, hospitals and specialized centers belonging to the directorate.

This program comes after Heevie teams performed the required assessments to determine the shortages and needs existed within different DOH Duhok facilities. Heevie project is aiming to improve the skills and abilities of the health staff, and also develop and improve the interference mechanisms and the treatment and management protocols within different health facilities according to the below mechanisms:

1. Training and capacity building of the health care service providers from different branches and specialties.
2. Filling the gap regarding the shortage of staff of the health facilities which is done in coordination with the DOH through various mechanisms to respond to the increasing needs especially of the newly established facilities.
3. Management of patients with congenital anomalies, especially the congenital heart diseases, through providing the required medical care and management in addition to the special surgical treatment for selected cases who are in need for delicate surgical intervention in Italy.

The implementation of this project started early in 2018, and continues in this year through the below mentioned activities:

- 1- Supporting the staff of the Neonatal ICU of Heevie Pediatrics Teaching Hospital and ICU and CCU of Azadi teaching hospital.
- 2- Training courses for the medical staff in Italy.
- 3- Training courses for the doctors in both Cardiac Catheterization and Vascular Surgery.

The number of health staff supported/ trained: (44) persons.

21.Project: Adoption

Among the constant activities of Heevie Organization is the Adoption program which helps to find financial resources for the children of the poor families in KRI. The project concentrates on building the social relations between Kurdish and the Italian societies. Within this program, Heevie links the fundraisers from Italy, who are interested in donations, to the patient children descending from poor families. During the year 2019, many families received donations for their children from Italy as a part of this program's activities.
